Please work with your club or unit to sign up volunteers. Ladies are welcome too! Only a few hours of your time is needed.



Shrine Patients to Watch in Rio's Paralympic Games

Born with a condition called fibular hemimelia, doctors told young Hunter Woohall that he would never walk. Now, this amazing 17-year old has earned a spot on the U.S. track team. Hemimelia is a shortening or absence of the fibula in the lower leg. Since he was born, Hunter has been a patient of Shriners Hospitals for Children - Tampa. When he was just 11 months of age, Hunter's parents made the difficult decision to have his feet amputated. Following surgery, Hunter was fitted with two prosthetic legs and quickly began to not only walk, but also run and eventually play sports with his two older brothers.

Brian Bell from Alabama will be going for gold in wheelchair basketball in the Paralympic Games. At age 10, Brian lost his right leg in a train accident. From that point, until age 18, he was a patient at Shriners Hospitals for Children - Greenville. Doctors encouraged him to try new activities, like football or basketball. Brian plays professional basketball in Italy and was selected for the U.S. Wheelchair Basketball team. He is also studying kinesiology and hopes to become a personal trainer and basketball coach.

A former patient of Shriners Hospital - Chicago, 22-year old Dalton Herendeen will be swimming for a medal in Rio. Losing his left leg due to a blood clot as an infant, Dalton went on to swim at the University of Indianapolis. He previously competed at the 2012 Paralympic Games in London. When he isn't training, Dalton coaches college swimmers at the University of Mary Washington in Fredericksburg, Virginia. In addition, Dalton is a Mason and his dad became a Shriner to give back for the inspiring care that his son received at Shriners Hospitals for Children.

When Natalie Sims of Minnesota was born missing part of her right arm, she immediately started receiving therapy and orthopaedic care at Shriners Hospitals for Children - Twin Cities. Six years ago, she started swimming, quickly becoming one of the top athletes on her local team. As a young girl, Natalie attended the Twin Cities Shriners Hospital's Camp Achieve, a weeklong day camp designed to inspire children to reach beyond the traditional limits of their physical conditions. Natalie was inspired to give back to other kids facing challenges and has volunteered at Camp Achieve for several years. In 2013, Natalie qualified for the U.S. Paralympic Swimming Emerging Team and started competing in the United States and abroad. She credits Shriners Hospitals with helping to fuel her competitive spirit.



A report from your Twin Cities BOG representative

Dear Fellow Nobles and Ladies,

Do you have a son, daughter or grandchild playing football, basketball or participating in some other sport this school year? Keep this number handy: 612-269-7021. That's the number for the newly expanded pediatric sports medicine program at Shriners Hospitals for Children – Twin Cities.

Dr. Michael Priola, who specializes in sports medicine and orthopedics, joined the team last year. He comes with vast training and a unique background. While serving in the Army, he was deployed to Afghanistan during Operation Enduring Freedom, where he provided orthopedic surgical services to servicemen and women from varying countries as well as to Afghan civilians. Among the doctors at Shriners Hospitals he is the only surgeon currently using a minimally invasive arthroscopic procedure to repair ACL, meniscus tears, shoulder and ankle injuries.

While many hospitals treat adult orthopedic injuries, Shriners Hospital thought that expanding the same services to children and teenagers would fit a growing need. The services provided through sports medicine are complementary to the other pediatric orthopedic conditions currently handled by the doctors; things like: limb deficiencies and prosthetics, hip disorders, clubfoot, stiff joints and others.


Dr. Priola said that any child suffering a sports-related injury should be fully examined, because there may be an underlying problem that caused the injury to occur in the first place. Shriners Hospitals brings together a complete team of specialists including the surgeons, pediatricians, occupational therapists, physical therapists, nutritionists and others to provide treatment and rehabilitation.

Services are available to any child under 18. They must have a suspected and/or documented fracture, and do not require emergency attention. For those families who qualify, financial assistance is available.
