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Membership Incentives 2017 Update

1. Each line signer, in good standing, will receive one point for a new petition, a restoration or an affiliation.

For each succeeding five petitions, he will receive a diamond in his membership medallion for a maximum of five diamonds. HOSPITAL HAPPENINGS

A report from your Twin Cities BOG representative

Dear Nobles and Ladies,

With much sadness, this will be my last article as your hospital representative for the Twin-Cities. After much reflection on what is in the best interest of the Board of Governors, I submitted my resignation to the board for Shriners Hospitals for Children – Twin Cities in March.

It has been a deeply satisfying experience to serve on the board for the past four years. As a former patient of the Shrine hospital system, I have thoroughly enjoyed participating in the governance of the Twin Cities hospital; sharing information with our Nobles and ladies about the remarkable and life-changing medical care provided by the doctors, nurses and staff; and, witnessing the success stories that make our efforts on the board worthwhile.

In January I accepted a position in the office of one of our state senators in Nebraska. It has been both fascinating and challenging, and I have enjoyed the change of career. Unfortunately, the schedule of the legislature does not afford me the flexibility of being gone monthly, as my previous position allowed. In good conscience, I felt I would not be able to devote the time needed to be an <u>effective</u> board member.

The Twin-Cities Board has requested at least three **applications be submitted by May 12**. Ill Sir Keith Will has all of the materials needed for the application process. **Any Noble in good standing may apply for the position.** As part of the application process the board requests individuals of diverse talents, abilities and points of view. Preferential consideration is given to nominees with education and/or law experience in the following areas: marketing or public relations, fundraising or donor development, those with business/community connections and relationships. I encourage all those interested to apply.

On a lighter note, I want to share with you a truncated summary of the recent Prom put on by your Twin-Cities hospital for our kids. It is this type of event that makes our hospital system special:

Our 7th annual Prom was held Saturday night at the Minnesota Masonic Home in Bloomington. We had over 100 patients RSVP, and most all of them joined us for this fantastic summery evening in April. Many of the kids were returning prom goers. We heard from numerous parents as they dropped off their kids that their child has been talking about coming to Prom since the invitation arrived in the mail! These prom-goers were so looking forward to seeing the friends they made in prior years.

The day started early Saturday with folks from Minnesota Cosmetology School arriving and setting up for the 50 kids who had appointments to get their hair, nails and makeup done. We even had two guys getting their hair "did" and nails buffed! (That's why they call it a MANicure) We had all the beauty stuff packed and stowed by 5:00, at which point the hallway was quickly transformed into the grand registry promenade including a welcome table complete with boutonnieres and corsages, a photo booth area and the grand line up staging area. Soon, the hallway was filled with lots of chatter. We had some timid first timers join in, but they were quickly brought into conversations with others as their parents left them.

The Maple Grove Link Crew joined us for the 3rd year in a row. They brought 40 kids to escort, dance and have fun with the other kids. Tough gig! This group of young adults did a phenomenal job. Many of them helped us last year and would not miss it for anything. To watch the groups mingle... honestly it was hard to tell who was who on the dance floor. Just teenagers being teenagers... the way it ought to be.

The dance floor and areas beyond were full all night long. They did not stop! The dance was to end at 10:00 pm, so finally at 10:30—with no signs of anyone leaving the dance floor—we sadly had to tell the DJ to shut 'er down. Some parents still had a four hour drive ahead of them and nowhere near the energy nor enthusiasm of their teen. It is so humbling to see these awesome parents who will drive for hours, spend the time, money and energy just so their kids can have this one night experience.

We had one young man attend for the first time; he is developmentally delayed, moves constantly and fast, and has minimal verbal skills. Two Link Crew members escorted him into the Grand March. This young man had never been on his own in a social setting quite like this before. His dad was a bit anxious and stayed nearby at the start. He was paired up with kids all night dancing, talking and walking around laughing. At the end of the night, while wearing and holding approximately 40 glow necklaces he had gathered from around the room, he greeted his parents with a big smile and told them he had fun. The huge smile on his face did a much better job of communicating this fact than his few words. We all said, "See you next year," and mom exclaimed, "Yes you will," as she cried happy tears.

We are fortunate to have the support from our leadership to let us do events like this for our patients, to have the donors who make these events happen for us, but most of all for the employees who helped behind the scenes to help make this event happen.

On a personal note, I want to thank the nobles of Sesostris for the honor of serving as your BOG representative for the past four years. It truly was a labor of love.


























Sesostris Shrine Widows Association
