

My theme for the year is "Rolling Into the Future."


The motto for the year is a quote from Helen Keller which is, "Alone we can do so little, Together we can do so much."












A report from your Twin Cities BOG representative Dear Nobles and Ladies, On December 5 Noble Gayle Angus, Noble John Best and I had the honor of being

part of a ceremony in which Ill. Sir Keith Plummer presented Dr. David Samani with a lifetime membership to Sesostris Shrine. This award was given in recognition of his longtime dedication to the welfare of our local Shrine patients and for the monthly screening clinics he and his staff provide free of charge to potential new Shrine patients. Talking with Dr. Samani it is easy to see his passion for his profession and our philanthropy. The screening clinic Dr. Samani helped create has become the model for other Shrine temples and Shrine hospitals. In 2016, the screening clinic saw 32 patients and accepted 30. Sesostris gained 22 patients and Tehama and Tangier each gained four new patients. The clinic truly helped the entire state of Nebraska!

As Shriners and Shrine ladies we not only want to help find new children we can help, but we like to acknowledge the outstanding qualities that these children possess. Each year, Shriners Hospitals for Children – Twin Cities recognizes patients who are role models to others through the Rainbow of Hope Awards. On May 20, 2017 during the "Hospital Day" at the SHC-TC winners of the award will be announced and

the patients will share their personal stories. Any Shriner or Shrine lady can nominate a patient for this award. Application forms can be picked up or mailed to you from our Sesostris business office. Nominations must be received by April 3.
