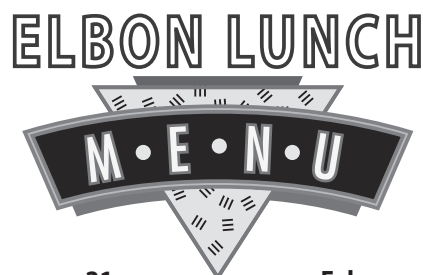
Becky and I hope you all had a blessed Christmas and great New Year. So, let’s make the year even better and have a lot of fun!!!!

In addition to classroom work, I do my own laundry, learn about cooking and cleaning and money management. I am also learning different jobs and going off campus twice a week to work. I learn about expectations and responsibilities on different jobs. My goals at NCECBVI are independent living and career readiness. I have enjoyed the challenges of this year and am looking forward to next year.

Obituary for Delbert Eugene Adams

Delbert Eugene Adams was born on September 3, 1926 in Bradford, Arkansas, the first-born child of Lee Adams and Vonja Powers Adams. In February of 1931 the family moved to Prairie Home, Nebraska. He attended the one room schoolhouse at Prairie Home, and also grade school in Havelock. In 1940 the family moved to South Lincoln where he attended College View High School and graduated in 1944. After High School he served in the US Army in Korea. In 1952 he married Shirley Fuhrman. They moved to Denver, Colorado in 1953 where their son Larry was born. In 1954 they returned to Lincoln where their daughter Shirlene was born.

Del worked at Goodyear for 35 years, retiring in 1988. He was a member of the UAW. He was an active member of the Lincoln Bowling Association for over 60 years. A lifetime member of VFW Post 131 where he served as Post Commander. He was a Past Master of Lancaster Masonic Lodge #54 and a lifetime member of the Sesostriis Shrine where he was a member of several units. He served 21 years as the Parade Coordinator as well as other positions. Del was also a member of the American Legion, and the DAV.

He passed away peacefully at 93 years of age on November 18, 2019 at The Journey House in Lincoln, Nebraska.

He was preceded in death by his parents, his younger siblings, Sister, Donna Maxine Burkhardt, Brothers, Norman Lee and John Adams, and Sister-In-Law, Betty Adams.

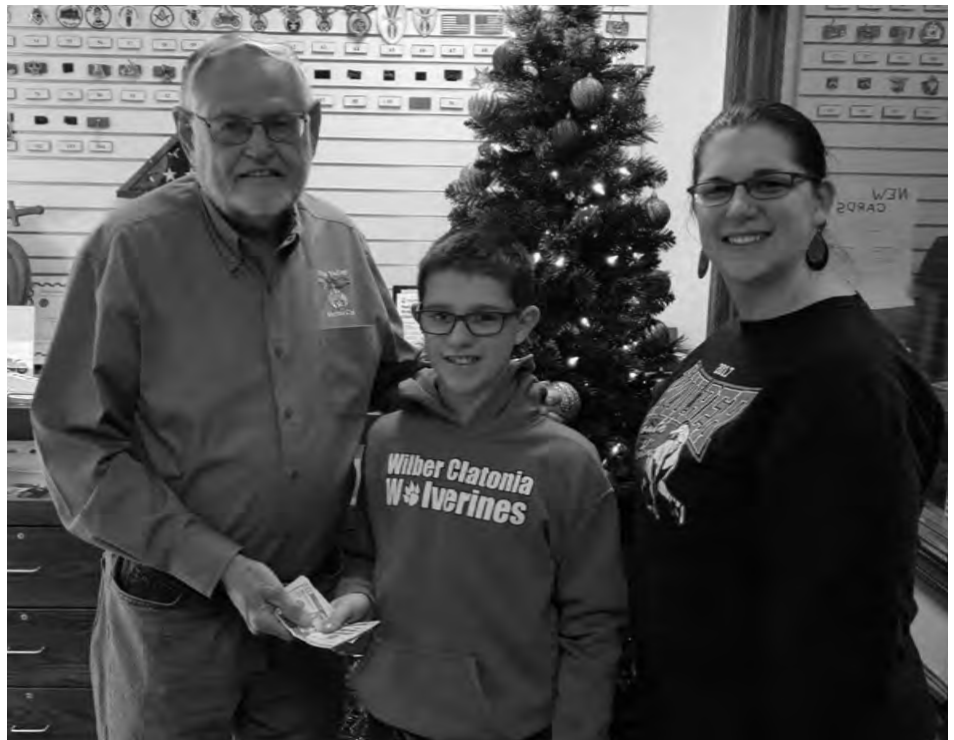

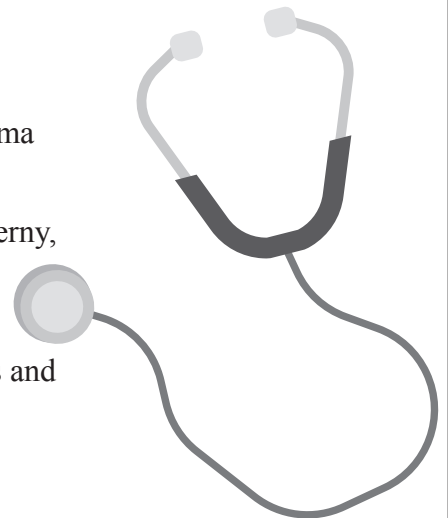
DR. SAMANI CLINIC UPDATE:

Day 1 Fly to Boston (D)

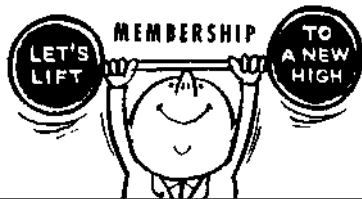

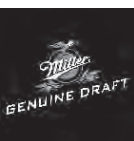

MEMBERSHIP INCENTIVES PROGRAM REVISED Effective January 1, 2020

1. Each line signer, in good standing, will receive one point for a new petition, a restoration or an affiliation.
2. After a Noble attains five points, he will receive a membership medallion with a red, green and yellow ribbon. For each succeeding five petitions, he will receive a diamond in his membership medallion for a maximum of five diamonds. Once he has been a line signer for 35 petitions, he will receive a gold ribbon to wear with his membership medallion.
3. Each TOP LINE SIGNER who is a line signer for TWO Nobles in any given calendar year will be eligible to receive a "membership achiever" polo shirt.
4. Each TOP LINE SIGNER who is a line signer for FIVE Nobles in any given calendar year will be eligible to have his Sesostris Shrine dues paid for the next calendar year.
5. Line signers, if they desire, may place the Fez on their new Noble during the fezzing ceremony.
